


LUXEMBOURG



The main characteristic of Luxembourg's national research and innovation (R&I) system is its youth. The support policy for R&I was introduced only in 1981 and the University of Luxembourg, founded in 2003, is one of the youngest universities in Europe. In this context, R&D and innovation in Luxembourg is predominantly financed by the private sector. A small country, Luxembourg manages to place nine companies in the top thousand



European R&D industrial performers.

Where the private spending had fluctuations over the last decade, the public R&D spending has increased steadily. Luxembourg will need to ensure an increased efficiency and effectiveness of spending of the financial resources devoted to R&I. Attracting and keeping the necessary human resources for developing local competitive centres of excellence while ensuring an enhanced collaboration between public research organisations and private companies will need continued attention.
